EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Set up and directed the actions of the first urban Conservancy in the United States; reported to a twenty-member Board, supervised an Executive Secretary, and recruited four part-time volunteers. First urban Conservancy created by the State to serve directly: 66 cities, two counties, numerous legislative representatives and over five million residents. The Conservancy was created to attract funding for open space, improved water quality, wildlife corridors, and low-impact recreation; build an understanding for natural processes and the need to coordinate activities among agencies.

Planning

- Developed a Watershed, Parkway, and Open Space Plan that involved most of the State, County, City, and NGO's operating within the 1640 square mile territory. This plan has been approved by over 65 agencies and cities and will be implemented in Phase II of the planning process that is currently underway. . The American Planning Association gave the plan the 2002 Los Angeles Section Comprehensive Planning Large Jurisdiction Award and the 2003 State of California Comprehensive Planning Large Jurisdiction Award.
